
# BRADNESSLER COMES HOME.

very kid dreams of making it to the pros; working your way up to the big leagues and leading your home team to a dramatic victory. Brad Nessler's childhood dream had a special twist. Brad wanted to become a broadcaster, not a player. As a kid he practised on his small reel-to-reel tape recorder. As freshman in college, he began on-air radio work and, by the age of 25, was the youngest NFL broadcaster calling the action of the Atlanta Falcons. Six years later, he returned to his home turf as the voice of the Minnesota Vikings on WCCO Radio.

Countless days and nights of listening intently to Ray Scott, Herb Carneal, Halsey Hall and Ray Christensen led Brad to pursue his dream. He played football in elementary school and was the team captain in high school. "I never really wanted to be a pro player. I was more fascinated with Herb Carneal and Ray Christensen. I'd even listen at night with an earphone so my parents would think I was sleeping," said Nessler.

"We're a very sports-related family," he continued. "On a typical Sunday, we'd go to church, have a big breakfast and watch football."

Brad met his wife, Nancy while they both attended Mankato State University. When he was hired by the Falcons, they

moved to a suburb of Atlanta called Duluth, Georgia, named after Duluth, Minnesota. Their one year-old daughter, Reis, was born the same day as Brad.

To relax during his spare time, Brad takes his boat out on a nearby lake. Brad jokes, "It's getting so dry there that I'm considering putting wheels on it." He keeps in shape by lifting weights and playing pool at home, "and I also dabble in karate, from my blow-by-blow days covering karate for ESPN."

As the voice of the Vikings on WCCO Radio, Brad prepares for more than a week before each game, calling the teams, and reading up on the teams and players. "I've always loved this work. I'm really in my own little world every time I do a game. It's a great feeling to do a job you love this much."
